PRIOR TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ACTIVITIES

**Meeting with the university and organizations authorities in each country** to present the project and define the role of the institution.

Meeting SL(M) to get to know each other and consolidate the SL(M) Teams in each country.

To appoint the **Monitoring Committee** (*USC, together with a partner from each country*) that will be **responsible for ensuring the proper management of the project**.

Institutional presentation of the project to the media at a press conference.

Opening of the project's website and social networks.

PARTNERSHIPS WORK **Face-to-face meetings:** Three (3) face-to-face meetings are planned: one before starting to develop the project activities (Santiago de Compostela-Spain), one meeting to monitor the implementation of the activities (Galway-Ireland), and a final meeting to close the project (Verona-Italy).



**E-mail communication:** Three (3) email accounts (one per project team) will be activated to facilitate communication.

**Online meetings:** These will be scheduled before the start of each WP (to plan, clarify doubts, set deadlines, etc.) and at the end of the activities in order to evaluate how they have been developed, identifying strengths and weaknesses.











- A **MONITORING COMMITTEE** will be set up to ensure that activities and deadlines are met. It will meet at least **once per quarter** to analyse the progress of the work, to introduce changes in the planning and, if necessary, to solve problems and take the necessary measures for the proper functioning of the project. It will be made up of the 5 partners.
- **Different meetings are planned that will allow us to evaluate the project**. The online meetings that will be scheduled before the start of each work package (to plan, clarify doubts, set deadlines, etc.) and at the end of each one (evaluation).
- The partners will work and update the **indicators** for each WP in order to identify weaknesses and strengths in the implementation of the project and in the dissemination strategy to ensure the greatest impact of the action.
- Different **instruments (project evaluation)** will be distributed to the participants in all activities in order to collect quantitative and qualitative data
